The University community is being urged to make submissions to Government by April 30 - or lose guaranteed representation in the governance of its own institution.

The Education Amendment Bill (No 2) proposes that the size of university councils will be reduced and only the Minister and Maori will have a mandated presence. Under threat is the involvement of key groups - students, staff and graduates.

"Universities are now at grave risk of losing their independence and their voice as a critic and conscience of society," says the President of the University of Auckland Society, Amy Malcolm.



Land law interests Tongan scholarship winner


