

## New Research Works Wonders video

In recent years there has been an alarming increase in the rate of gestational diabetes, which has been occurring in parallel with the rapidly escalating rates of obesity in women. Researchers Professor Lesley McCowan (the University of Auckland), Dr Kara Okesene-Gafa (Counties Manukau District Health Board) and Mafi Funaki-Tahifote (Heart Foundation) are asking questions about how this can be addressed.

If this research is successful, we have potential to improve health of mothers and babies and potentially reduce the cycle of childhood obesity.
