# FAQs

## What are majors and do I have to have two?

Yes, you must have two. A major is the main subject area you will be studying during your Bachelors degree.

## What is Waipapa Taumata Rau (WTR100)?

This required course teaches you essential academic skills and sets you up for success for the rest of your studies.

## What are electives?



Elective courses can come from a variety of disciplines including your main major, but they can also come from other degree schedules such as Arts or Commerce.

They are what make up the remainder of your required points to complete your BA.

## How many courses do I enrol in?

Four courses per semester is full time study – 8 courses in a year. We suggest that you enrol in two courses for Stage I for each of your majors. That means you will have 4 courses remaining to choose from electives and general education.

## Can I explore more than two majors?

It's good to take at least three different subjects in your first year, two of which will become your majors and a third to expand your knowledge.

## What do I do if the courses I want to take don't fit in my timetable or there is a clash?
