

## To be able to enrol into the Thesis for MArch(Prof)



Remember: We only calculate your GPA with the best 90 points from taught courses to determine if you have achieved an Average B- ( GPA 4.0) to allow you to continue in the programme and enrol into the thesis

## **Other Important Information**

The total **enrolment points** for a masters degree must not exceed the minimum points required for that degree by more than 40 points. For example, the required points for the MArch(Prof) is 240 points, therefore the total enrolment points cannot exceed 280 points. Withdrawn (W) courses and failed courses count towards the enrolment points limit.

There are specific **time limits** for completion of masters degrees (see table below). If you are intending to take a break from your study, you will need to apply for a <u>suspension</u>, as even semesters with no enrolments count towards the time limit.

MArch(Prof)UrbPlan(Prof)	4.0 (or B- average) or higher over 180 points in the taught courses
