Grounded in Te Tiriti o Waitangi, the foundational concept of this programme revolves around Mauri Ora (wellbeing) and will enable you to contribute directly to social justice efforts through a variety of experiential learning opportunities, such as internships, community-based research projects, and service learning.

The Mātauranga Māori specialisation examines concepts of social justice through a mātauranga lens and includes:

- Two courses each year that will focus on written and spoken te reo Māori, allowing you to develop a high level of proficiency.
- Developing knowledge and skills to work with iwi/hapū, in Māori and Indigenous education, in public service, social services and entrepreneurship.
- Subjects include Rethinking Oceania Connections, Rangatahi-led Political Action and Amplifying Indigenous Voices.
