
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## BHSc degree planner

2024 regulations. Total: 360 points. See the Student Hubs for degree planning advice.







Total 360 points (24 courses at 15 points each). Of the 360 points required for this degree, a student must pass:

- At least 135 points from the core courses listed in the Bachelor of Health Sciences Schedule.
- 2. Up to 120 points from the elective courses listed in the Bachelor of Health Sciences Schedule.
- 3. The requirements of a major of Population Health in Year 3.
- a) 30 points (2 courses) must be taken from courses offered in either the General Education Open Schedule or the General Education Faculty Schedule approved for this degree.
- A student who is required to meet the Academic English Language Requirement, may substitute an approved academic English course for 15 points General Education.
- In order to meet the requirements for General Education students must pass the Academic Integrity Course.

It is the student's responsibility to check that the final programme complies with University Regulations. Please visit the Student Hubs for any assistance with your degree planning.


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## BHSc degree pathway suggestions for years 2 and 3




Māori health is a fundamental component of the BHSc and therefore integral to all five pathways. MAORIHTH 201 is a core paper in the degree, and students wishing to deepen their knowledge should also take MAORIHTH 301 in Year 3.

The two Pacific Health courses (POPLHLTH 213 and 312) can be taken in conjunction with any of the pathways. Students wanting to take POPLHLTH 213 in Year 2 are advised to complete their second GENED course in Year 3 if their preferred pathway contains two essential Year 2 papers.

POPLHLTH 313 (Health in Asian Communities) can be taken in conjunction with any of the five pathways.

These are papers strongly recommended to take if you are interested in following one of the suggested career pathways



Enrol in at least six Stage III courses if you intend to continue to a postgraduate programme of study.
