
2025 LLB Part II Admission

For NEW STUDENTS to the University of Auckland, commencing LLB conjoint degree under current regulations (excluding BAdvSci(Hons)/LLB and BE(Hons)/LLB).



- (i) This conjoint plan allows students to complete the degree program in five years, but this involves a heavier-than-normal workload in four of those years. There is no requirement to finish within the minimum timeframe; students may choose to enrol for a more manageable load by extending their study period to five years plus one semester (or longer).
- (ii) A BE(Hons)/LLB conjoint degree meets the requirements of two professional bodies. Students should expect the program to take six years and are advised to consult with Student Hubs for guidance.
- (iii) In Year 2 and Year 3, the order of LAW 201-241 can be varied. This diagram shows just one possible arrangement.
- (iv) Students wishing to participate in a 60-point or 120-point Law Exchange in their final year may need to rearrange their degree structure and consider taking courses during Summer School.

#### Requirements for LLB conjoint degrees combination (not including BAdvSci(Hons)/LLB or BE(Hons)/LLB): Total: 675 points

- (i) 255 points as listed in the other bachelors component in the Conjoint Component Requirements Schedule
- (ii) 405 points as listed in the LLB component in the Conjoint Component Requirements Schedule
- (iii) 15 points from courses listed in the General Education Schedules available for the non-Law degree or the conjoint degree
- (iv) The University of Auckland Academic Integrity Course as specified in the Enrolment and Programme Regulations, Academic Integrity, of the University Calendar.
- \*15 point General Education course is to be taken in any of years 1-4, including Summer School.
- \*\* Other Conjoint Course may be taken in any of years 2-6, including Summer School.

- \*\*\* LAW 458 is an elective for the LLB, but the Council for Legal Education (CLE) requires it for students intending to be admitted to the Bar.

Requirements for other Bachelors component only (not including BAdvSci(Hons) or BE(Hons)): Total: 255 points (17 other degree courses at 15 points each).

It is the student's responsibility to check that the final programme complies with University Regulations. The other faculty is the final authority on all other bachelor regulations and the Law School is the final authority on all LLB regulations.

Students usually take LAW 121G and three 15pt non-law courses in Semester one. In Semester two, students usually take LAW 131, LAW 141 and two 15pt non-law courses. In total, you should have at least 75pts of non-law courses alongside LAW 121G, LAW 131, and LAW 141.
