
# Sample LLB Degree Structure - LAW 298 + 3x LLB Part II Courses

For NEW STUDENTS to the University of Auckland, commencing LLB degree under current regulations.



- (i) This LLB plan allows completion of the LLB degree programme in four years, but it involves a heavier than normal load in two of those. There is no need to complete within the minimum timeframe, and students may wish to enrol for a more manageable load by extending the overall timeframe.
- (ii) In Year 2 and Year 3, the order of LAW 201-241 can be varied. This diagram shows just one possible arrangement.
- (iii) Students are unable to participate in a 60-point or 120-point Law Exchange with this arrangement.

## Requirements for LLB degree, Total: 480 points Part I

120 points including:

- 45 points: LAW 121 or 121G, 131, 141
- 15 points from courses listed in the General Education Schedules available for the non-Law degree or the conjoint degree
- 60 points from courses prescribed for one other undergraduate degree programme at this University

Note: A student enrolling in LLB Part I will, in respect of the courses other than LAW 121G, 131 and 141, be required to enrol in the degree of the University of Auckland for which such courses are prescribed or available.
