



# Academic Planning Worksheet for Semester Exchanges

### **Seeking Degree Planning Advice**

### **Specified Credit vs. Unspecified Credit**

#### **SPECIFIED CREDIT:**

Where you have a specific course requirement needed to complete your major or degree, generally specified credit will be required. E.g. POPHLTH 101 and POPHLTH 102 are specific courses which all BHSc students must complete as part of their degree plan.

Where you have a specific course requirement in your degree, you would need to be able to find a comparable host university course that matches the specific paper taught at the University of Auckland in order to receive specified credit from an exchange. It can be difficult to obtain approval for specified course matches on exchange due to variations in each partner university's curriculum and changes in course schedules. Where possible, we advise that you look to complete any specific course requirements here in Auckland, before/after going on exchange, or at least be open to the possibility of completing these on return.

#### **UNSPECIFIED CREDIT:**

If you are interested in taking a host university course where there is no comparable course taught at the University of Auckland, you may be able to receive approval for 'unspecified' credit. Unspecified credit is more likely to be approved towards non-major requirements, and spaces in your degree plan that do not list a specific University of Auckland course to be completed. Unspecified credit is often used towards General Education Exemptions, 'Any Stage' courses, and some Elective courses. You are less likely to receive approval for unspecified credit towards Stage III Major requirements.

E.g. 15 points of Arts Unspecified 100LVLmay be used towards an Any Arts Stage I requirement in your degree planner.

### Going on exchange in your final year or semester

Except for Law students, who can only go on exchange in Part 4 of the LLB degree, most undergraduate students are advised to go on exchange in year 2, or while completing Part II requirements. Going on exchange in Stage III may be possible, but it's important to be aware of potential challenges. Unless you have carefully planned your course schedule in your earlier years, be aware that you may run into more challenges the later in your degree that you go on exchange, when you have less flexibility in your degree.

Be prepared for the possibility that your graduation may be delayed if going on exchange in your final year, and particularly in your final semester. We cannot guarantee that you will be able to enrol into all of the courses that you require for graduation while on exchange, and transcripts from the host university may also be delayed, which has the potential to affect the credit transfer process for those applying for graduation immediately upon return from exchange.
