Application procedure	After nomination of the exchange students by their home university (by Email), the International Relations Office of Heidelberg University will send out the information on the Online Application for exchange students . Students will have to fill out the application form for admission online, print it, sign it and upload it again.	

Application documents

A signed copy of the online application form for admission has to be uploaded. Students need to indicate on the online form that they wish to

- register for the German preparatory language course
- apply for student housing.

In addition to the online application form, exchange students need to upload the following items for formal admission:

- University transcripts
- Passport-size photograph

After the application has been processed, a letter of admission will be issued around June/July for Fall and January/February for Spring.

Suggested length of study for exchange

For a successful exchange experience, we recommend a study stay of one to two semester.

Furthermore, we strongly recommend the participation in the preparatory German language course before lecture start (September or March see information below).



Procedure of applying for student visa

Generally, citizens of the USA, Canada, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, South Korea, and EFTA countries usually do not need a VISA to travel to Germany but need to apply for their residence permit after their arrival in Germany.

Citizens of other countries have to apply well in advance for their VISA before travelling to Germany!

Documents needed from home to apply for a residence permit:

- Letter of sufficient funding from bank; notarized parental letter
- Proof of health insurance (German state Health insurance or sufficient health insurance coverage if provided from home country)

<u>Programs not available</u> to exchange students are courses offered at the school of medicine and dentistry.

<u>Restrictions</u> may apply for some courses in biosciences or biotechnology, and for some courses in law. Exceptions can be made with the permission from the coordinator in Heidelberg.

Please note that Heidelberg University does not offer programs in Business, Agriculture, or at a college of Music/ Arts and only partly programs in Engineering.

Course Catalog



Most information on the course offerings for the coming semester will be available online only a few months before the lecture periods starts.

Language of Instruction

Typically, the language of instruction is German. Therefore, a (good) knowledge of **German** is helpful and students may choose the exchange stay to get or improve their knowledge of German.

However, there are several <u>fields of study</u> with a (large) variety of **courses taught in English**: i.e. English Studies, American Studies, Economics, South Asian Studies, and Transcultural Studies. There are also a few courses offered in English in Sociology, Political Science and Psychology. https://www.uni-heidelberg.de/en/study/all-subjects



Many Masters programs are taught (fully or partly) in English. Some of these courses may also be available for advanced Bachelor students.

You do not need to login, you can go directly to '**courses**' => click on 'Picture with students'. The language of instruction can be chosen via the filter function.

Under "Organisation - Heidelberg University" you can find the different departments. If you are looking for a specific department, you may need to use the German title of the department. To get an overview of previous course offers you can choose different semester under 'Term'.

German Language Instruction

Preparatory German Language course

We strongly encourage exchange students to register for the **4-week intensive German language course at the International Study Center (ISZ).** The course is offered **before the start of the semester,** in September for fall semester students and in March for spring semester students. Attending the course will not only improve the language skills, but also help to become familiar with Heidelberg University and build a new circle of friends before the lecture period starts.

The program includes 80 hours of language instruction at all levels (basic, intermediate and advanced). All courses contain exercises dealing with German grammar, conversation, reading and writing, listening comprehension, lexis, phonetics, regional and cultural studies, and information about studying in Heidelberg. www.isz.uni-heidelberg.de/e_courses_vdk.html

The fee for the preparatory language course is covered by the International Relations Office for exchange students!

German Language Instruction



Students who want further training for their German language proficiency **during the lecture period** are offered a large variety of different language programs at the University's International Study Center (ISZ). They may choose between a 4-and an 8-hour per week general German language course or/ and can select subject-related German courses. These courses complement the regular courses of all study subjects offered at Heidelberg University.

Students without or with limited German language experience have the opportunity to attend a full time intensive (20 hour per week) language course in which 24 ECTS can be earned per semester. Please consult the exchange coordinator for further information prior to the exchange stay.

Living in student residences is the <u>most affordable and most convenient</u> way of living in Heidelberg as an exchange student. The private housing market in Heidelberg is very tight. Therefore all exchange students are encouraged to consider living in student residences by the Studierendenwerk Heidelberg. Types of accommodation:

- single room sharing kitchen and bathrooms in groups of 2 4
- single room in dormitories with kitchens and bathrooms on each floor
- small number of single apartments

Range of rent: approx. 250 – 560 EURO per Month; plus 450 EURO refundable deposit per stay

Insurances

Health insurance with unlimited coverage is compulsory for all Heidelberg University students. Exchange Students are advised to take out health insurance in Germany (a highly comprehensive coverage), or to ensure to bring full and unlimited health insurance coverage from their country of residence.



<u>Please note:</u> Students who plan to stay longer than one semester in Heidelberg need to take out German Health insurance coverage!
