

# Justice Sir Rober Chambers Memorial Moot Prize

## Description

The Prize has been awarded since 2015 to the winners and runners-up in the annual Justice Sir Robert Chambers Memorial Mooting Competition. The Prize is funded by Deborah, Lady Chambers, KC, in memory of Sir Robert Chambers KNZM QC, who was a judge of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, and an alumnus of, and lecturer at, the University of Auckland.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law (or nominee)

## Regulations

1. The Prize will be known as the Justice Sir Rober Chambers Memorial Moot Prize.
2. Four Prizes will be awarded annually, up to a total of \$3,000.
3. Two Prizes of \$1,000 each will be awarded annually to the winners of the Justice Sir Robert Chambers Memorial Mooting Competition in the Faculty of Law.
4. Two Prizes of \$500 each will be awarded annually to the runners-up in the Justice Sir Robert Chambers Memorial Mooting Competition in the Faculty of Law.
5. The Prizes will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law (or nominee).
6. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Law shall determine if the Prizes may be shared.
7. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there are no candidates that meets the criteria and/or no candidates of sufficient merit.
8. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
